*According to a 2018 Crain’s Chicago Business article, “Chicago’s emergence as a competitive innovation economy cannot come through a false insistence that this is in fact already happening.”*

*Because of the universities and globally respected companies that call this region home, Chicago has a legitimate research and innovation heritage. Now, the city’s challenge is to keep pace with the fast-changing technology sector and the benefits it has to offer.*

In selecting this topic, your *Table* will discuss Chicago’s position regarding technology and innovation. Here are some points to consider:

- Over the last 12 years, the Chicago tech venture capitalist market has supported 5 percent of the value of venture deals as seen in the Bay Area, 19 percent of those seen in New York, 21 percent of those seen in Boston, and about a third of those in Los Angeles.
- In 2016, 179 tech companies in the city raised around \$1.7 billion, according to data compiled by Built In Chicago. That’s more than a \$1 billion increase since 2012, when tech companies raised \$391 million.
